# Stop taking 'selfies' with wild animals

Care for the Wild is calling on tourists to stop taking 'selfies' with wild animals.

There are many opportunities to do this including lion and tiger cubs available in Mexico, lion cubs a speciality in South Africa and Thailand hosting a range of tiger-petting facilities.

Care for the Wild is asking tourists to check:

- that the animal still has its teeth and claws and look at the conditions it sleeps in
- for marks where it's been beaten, and
- where it's going to end up when it's no longer cute enough for photos.

Care for the Wild is about to launch No Photos, Please!, a campaign asking tourists to say 'no' if offered the chance to have a photo with a wild animal, in Thailand.

The No Photos, Please! Campaign is part of their RIGHT-tourism.org project, which gives tourists advice on how to be animal-friendly in every country of the world.

In addition, guidelines from ABTA launched last year lists activities where people can have their photo taken with captive wild animals, or even free-roaming wild animals as 'unacceptable' and these should not be offered by British tour operators.

Following successful European installations in Catalonia, Spain in June and Mayo, Ireland in July, the *CHANGING TRACKS* project will place the artworks in a non-traditional, outdoor exhibition spaces.

Covering more than 41,000 hectares, the Nene Valley extends for 35 miles between Northampton and Peterborough, incorporating the River Nene and bordering the ancient Rockingham Forest.

Northamptonshire is also known for historic homes such as Althorp, the resting place of Princess Diana, and Boughton House, which was a film set for the BAFTA and Oscar award-winning Les Miserables.

# **Tour de Turtles, Florida Keys**

A loggerhead sea turtle, rehabilitated at the Florida Keys-based Turtle Hospital, was fitted with a satellite-tracking transmitter and released from a Florida Keys beach in August 2014.

it was the last sea turtle to join the *Tour de Turtles*, a three-month-long 'race' that features public online monitoring of the progress of 11 sea turtles, which is organized by the Sea Turtle Conservancy.

*Tour de Turtles* follows the long-distance migration of several different species of sea turtles from their nesting beaches to foraging grounds. The turtle that covers the most distance is declared the winner.

'Competitors' have been released off coastlines into the Atlantic Ocean as well as eastern and western Caribbean habitats.

The satellite transmitters eventually fall off of the turtles after their batteries are exhausted.

The SS Shieldhall, moored at Berth 48 in the Eastern Docks, Southampton, has officially been recognised as a passenger ship, some 59 years after coming into operation as a sludge carrier for the Glasgow Corporation.

In its early years Shieldhall was known as a 'Banana Boat' or 'Bovril Boat' due to its distinctive colour and even more distinctive cargo. Today it is a passenger vessel, carrying passengers on journeys in and around Southampton Water and The Solent.'

In April 2013 SS Shieldhall was awarded a Heritage Lottery Fund grant of some £1.4 million, to secure the future of the ship for the next 25 years.

# Get Off My Back - tourists should avoid elephant trekking

Animal welfare charity, Care for the Wild International, says that increasing numbers of tourists and tour operators are saying 'no' to elephant trekking as they realise the suffering and cruelty involved in what has long been a 'Bucket List' favourite.

Riding on the back of an elephant in countries like Thailand and India has been seen as a way of getting close to both the elephants and the culture of those countries, but information about how these treks impact on the elephants has become more available.

#### These include:

- elephants must be 'tamed' before they can take part in treks this almost inevitably involves beatings and being kept in small cages while young until they are broken
- young elephants are taken from the wild often with the result of their mother being killed to supply the tourist trade
- elephants, while strong, are not designed to carry heavy weights on their backs, so carrying tourists all day will be causing suffering, and
- conditions for many of these elephants will be hard and relentless, including long days, and being chained when they are not working.

Responsible Travel.com has announced that it would no longer supply tours which involved elephant treks or performances, joining STA Travel and Intrepid Travel who brought in similar bans in the last couple of months.

# Autumn adventure activities in the Azores

The nine islands of the Azores are in the middle of the North Atlantic belong to Portugal and are known for their craters, beautiful lakes, stunning sea, thermal pools and mountain vistas and impressive flora and fauna and marine life.

With average highs of 23 °C during the autumn months, attracts an array of underwater wildlife.

#### Adventure activities include:

# **Autumn surfing**

The Azores offer consistent conditions all year round, but in the autumn, ground and wind swells can reach 15 feet.

Santa Barbra Beach on Sao Miguel Island, one of the best surfing locations in the archipelago, offers surfing spots and conditions for all ability levels.

Other popular surfing beaches can be found on Santa Maria Island, and Sao Jorge Island, where reef breaks provide long and tube shaped waves.

# Big game fishing

The archipelago's waters are home to some of the world's most impressive big pelagic fish, which can be found just a few miles from the coast.

These include the prized Atlantic Blue Marlin, the Atlantic Blue Fin Tuna, Dolphin-fishes, Blue & White Marlin and Yellow Fin and Swordfish.

In terms of size, these fish are giants and 6 out of 10 world records for the Atlantic Blue Marlin have been achieved here.

# Diving

The Azores' deep oceans offer a vibrant underwater world for divers of all levels until the end of October.

Mild ocean temperatures and world-class diving sites provide up-close encounters with creatures including manta rays, morays, stingrays, dusky groupers, comb groupers, wrasses, parrot fishes, trigger fishes, breams and damselfishes.

#### **Whales**

It is 30 years since the last whaling factory closed on the islands, and this autumn travellers can go in search of the 25 cetacean species commonly seen in the Azores, one of the world's top whale watching destinations.

RIB boats depart from the islands of Sao Miguel, Pico and Faial, offering the chance to see these creatures play at the surface of the ocean.

The Loggerhead, Sperm, Fin and Atlantic Whales, as well as Bottlenose and Common Dolphin, are seen in September and October.

Special displays can also be found at the Lajes Whaling Museum on Pico Island and the Porto Pim Whaling Museum on Faial Island.

# Canyoning

Until the end of October, the Azores enjoys ideal conditions for canyoning, which requires thrill-seekers to cascade down waterfalls, climb over volcanic rock formations, walk, run, wade, abseil, boulder hop and swim through volcanic landscapes, subtropical fauna, caves, lakes and waterfalls which tumble into the ocean.

Routes vary in difficulty, with the most advanced circuits on the island of Sao Miguel, and more relaxed routes on the islands of Sao Miguel and Sao Jorge.

Other active pursuits on offer during autumn in the Azores include golf, paragliding, mountain biking, hiking, trekking and walking, sailing, stand up paddle boarding and horse riding.
