The New Zealand Department of Conservation (DOC) has launched a new weekly campsite pass, which gives the flexibility to pay once and stay up to seven nights at 100 different DOC campsites around New Zealand.

These include the Kapowairua Spirits Bay campsite in Kaitaia and the Kumeti campsite in Hawke's Bay. Other sites include Uretiti in the Whangarei area in the North Island, offering campers the chance to camp behind sand dunes at Uretiti Beach and explore the nearby Waipu caves.

Pub crawl controls in Calvià, Mallorca

The Municipality of Calvià has imposed tighter controls over the operation of pub crawl organisers.

Calvia is a municipality located on the southwest corner of Mallorca. The region is home to six wellestablished resorts (Magaluf, Palmanova, Portal Nous, Illetes, Santa Ponca and Peguera).

Companies operating pub crawls in Calvià now have to apply for a licence through the town hall, have civil insurances in place and whose pub crawl guides will have to wear a specific jackets.

Pub crawl groups can now not exceed more than 50 people.

The London Theatre Report

The London Theatre Report, authored by Alistair Smith, has been published by by the National Theatre and the Society of London Theatre (SOLT).

It is the first comprehensive analysis of its type and highlights the significance and variety of London theatre.

Headline findings are :

- London has 241 professional theatres with a seating capacity of more than 110,000
- In 2012/13, more than 22 million people attended London theatre performances
- In 2012/13, London theatre took £618.5m at the box office, more than was taken by London cinemas
- Theatres range in size from the 30-seat Lord Stanley Pub to the 3,600-seat Hammersmith Apollo
- At any one time, London's theatres engage more than 3,000 performers.
- In 2012/13, the average theatre ticket price paid in London was £27.76. This was down on 2011/12.

The findings point to London being the most significant theatre capital in the world.

The Urbanna Oyster Festival, Virginia, USA 7 and 8 November 2013

Virginia is known as the Oyster Capital of the East Coast and the state is now the largest producer of fresh, farm-raised oysters in America.

And 75,000 visitors are expected to go to the quiet tidewater town of Urbanna in Virginia, one of the oldest and smallest towns in America for its oyster festival.

The Urbanna Oyster Festival is Virginia's official oyster festival and one of the largest and oldest festivals of its kind in the USA.

Located along the Rappahannock River, Urbanna is a rural community with a land mass of less than half a square mile and a quiet way of life in a sheltered deep-water creek on a tributary of the Chesapeake Bay.

Virginia has seven different oyster regions.

The World Land Trust

The World Land Trust (WLT), the international conservation charity, is celebrating 25 years of successfully protecting the world's most biologically important and threatened habitats.

An essential part of the Trust's philosophy is to work through local conservation groups, and to help build their capacity so that they are better able to protect the wildlife in their countries and the habitats on which they depend.

The WLT has announced the successful protection of over 88,700 acres of land, in the 12 months to June 2014, to safeguard wildlife corridors and extend existing reserves.

The Trust also raised one million pounds raised in less than a year to save the rainforest home of Orang-utans.

The funds are being used to purchase strategically important parcels of forest in order to create the Keruak Corridor in the Bornean rainforest, ensuring that wildlife does not become isolated in forest fragments.

In addition to the work carried out in Borneo, World Land Trust has also saved acres in several Latin American countries during the last 12 months, including Bolivia and Mexico.

In Bolivia's Beni Savanna, WLT funding has helped double the size of Barba Azul Nature Reserve, home to the critically endangered Blue-throated Macaw.

In central Mexico, funds were used to extend a network of nature reserves in Sierra Gorda, an extraordinarily biodiverse area home to all six species of wild cat found in Mexico, including Jaguar, Puma and Ocelot.

Whale shark encounters In Mexico

The whale shark, which is not a whale and only technically a shark, is the largest fish on Earth.

This gentle creature can grow up to 60-feet in length all on a diet of algae, plankton, and krill.

Whale sharks live in all tropical and warm temperate seas but roam the oceans generally alone. However, large numbers will gather in areas with abundant plankton making them prime tourist attractions.

There are only a handful of places where they make predictable appearances during certain times of the year and one of the best is the nutrient-rich waters of the Midriff Island region in the Sea of Cortez.

From August into October, whale sharks averaging 25–40 feet long migrate to this area and can be observed and swum among.

To experience the whale sharks, Baja AirVentures flies its guests from San Diego to the remote Mexican fishing village of Bahia de los Angeles, population 500.

From there, boats shuttle guests to Las Animas Lodge situated on a private cove rimmed by a milelong crescent beach.

Guests spend up to five hours daily observing and swimming with whale sharks.

While the focus is on snorkelling with these creatures that naturally feed close to the surface, there are also afternoon outings to isolated islands and coves frequented by up to 10 species of whales (including fin and blue whales), as well as dolphins, sea lions, sea turtles and manta rays.

Faroese Chef Gutti is back has his own TV programme, celebrating the islands' gastronomic delights.

He introduces viewers to different islands that specialise in certain produce, and is happy to meet visitors.

When it comes to helicopter rides, locals take priority over tourists, who can usually only book a one-way ride, returning by boat (if the weather changes for the worse, then you may have to wait).

Due to the islands' location, in the restless Atlantic, and often fickle weather conditions, inter-island travel by boat in the Faroes can be tricky one minute and impossible the next. Helicopter rides are the equivalent of a local bus service.
