The Palio del Niballo recreates a day in 14th-century Faenza, with flag-wavers, knights, and drummers dressed in the colours of the town's five contending "rioni" (i.e. quarters) - White, Yellow, Black, Red and Green.

The palio consists of horseback riders hitting a revolving dummy, depicting a Saracen warrior (called the "Niballo"), with a spear.

During June, the rioni warm up with flag-waving and music competitions and the Bigorda d'Oro (a palio for younger racers).

An Alliance focus on :

International hotel star ratings

A recent Hotels4u/YouGov online survey of over 2,000 people has found that ninety-five percent of travellers are familiar with the one to five star rating system.

However, 71 per cent are unaware there is no standard international classification.

The survey also found that access to free wi-fi was the most important amenity of those listed (65%), for UK travellers when booking a hotel.

The list of traveller requirements were :

- Free Wi-Fi : 65%
- English-speaking staff 53%
- Swimming pool 48%
- Guest parking 41%
- 24-hour reception 40%
- A safe in the room 39%
- Laundry services 11%
- Concierge services 9%
- Children's club 7%
- A minibar in the room 7%
- A computer in the room 7%
- Step-free access 6%
- Fresh flowers 4%
- Sewing kit 4%

Star ratings for hotels across the globe can be determined in a variety of ways – by the local government to independent agencies.

There have been attempts to create an internationally recognised and reliable standard, without success, meaning rating criteria changes from country to country.

Hotel rating systems in some main tourist destinations

Hotels4u have created a breakdown of what 5* means to eight popular holiday destinations.

Spain

Spain doesn't manage its tourism industry nationally; instead, each region takes responsibility for its own hotel star rating system.

Standards are all regulated by the government tourism authority and all hotels have to offer standard facilities.

France

Hotels in France are all rated against the same criteria developed by the public tourist board department that has been enforced by the French Government.

Ratings are based on criteria, such as room size, lobby size, location, amenities and services.

Greece

Greece is a member of HOTREC (Hotels, Restaurants & Cafés in Europe).

HOTREC launched the European Hospitality Quality scheme (EHQ) which has since accredited the existing national inspection bodies for hotel rating.

Unlike other countries, the system isn't strict where room size and showering facilities are concerned.

The main criteria focus on quality management, wellness and sleeping accommodation.

There is a catalogue of criteria with 21 qualifications encompassing 270 elements – some mandatory, others optional.



International hotel star ratings (cont)

Great Britain

Great Britain awards star ratings to hotels based on the facilities provided for gueststhe quality of the welcome, service and hospitality of the staff, the food and thecleanliness.

These standards are agreed by the AA (Automobile Association) and UKtourist authorities (VisitBritain, VisitScotland and VisitWales).

Italy

It's evident that the Italian government takes the public's ability to trust statements of quality and standards seriously.

In 2009, a new star rating system was established with cleanliness being one of the main aspects on which hotels are judged.

Each star rating has a different cleaning criteria, with one star hotels changing bed sheets at least once a week, and five star being changed daily.

Turkey

In Turkey, most hotels are registered with the Ministry of Culture and Tourism.

This means they've been inspected and comply with certain standards depending on the rating they've been given.

Some smaller hotels are registered with the municipal authorities. They also have to fulfil a minimum standards requirement which is set by the local authorities.

Trusted endorsements

The survey also found that the most trusted endorsement of hotels comes from friends and family (32 per cent), followed by hotel review sites (22 per cent).

This corresponds with the rise in websites offering unbiased holiday reviews, such as Feefo, which has seen an 31 per cent year-on-year increase on Google Trends.

To help travellers using both traditional star ratings and peer-to-peer recommendations, Hotels4u has developed an international star ratings guide.
