

9 October 2015

Dresden's Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady)

22 to 31 October 2015

This autumn, Dresden's iconic Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) is celebrating the 10th anniversary of its reconstruction with a weeklong festival. At the end of World War II, nothing but a heap of rubble was left of one of the city's most beautiful buildings.

A unique rebuilding project that started in the 1990ies after the country's reunification helped restore the church.

The 'Handel in Autumn' Festival, Halle

20 to 22 November 2015

Halle's Handel in Autumn festival offers concerts featuring international top artists in this city on the Saale river.

Weimar Onion Market

9 to 11 October 2015

Celebrated since 1653, the festival is dedicated to all things onions including colourful onion braids that are decorated with dried flours.

The town centre becomes an open-air stage of market stalls with traders selling food, traditional handicraft and agricultural products, plus there are several stages for entertainment and music.

Wine festivals

Autumn sees a range of wine festivals in the area including in Saxony-Anhalt where Saale-Unstrut is Europe's northernmost wine region.

Wine villages stage wine festivals from September until the beginning of November.

In Saxony, Radebeul, just outside Dresden and at the centre of the Saxon Wine Route, is putting on a wine harvest festival from 25 to 27 September 2015.



Autumn colours

For autumn colours, the UNESCO World Heritage Site Hainich National Park in Thuringia is best visited at this time of year.

This primeval forest right in the middle of Germany covets an area of 7,500 hectares.

There are guided tours for visitors as well as numerous signposted trails taking hikers through this huge unexploited woodland area. Undisputed highlight: The treetop trail for stunning views on nature's finest from high above.

Cycling in Tuscany & the Dolomites with Adler Spa Resorts

Adler Resorts is a bijou collection of four Italian properties by the Sanoner family.

With three hotels in the Dolomites and one in Tuscany, Adler Spa Resorts offers the chance for serious cyclists to train at altitude, pushing themselves up steep mountain roads, while others might prefer the gentler slopes of the Tuscan hills.

Adler Dolomiti, which is situated in the heart of Ortisei, is within reach of the 30 cycling trails at altitudes between 700 and 2,450 metres, which are to be found in Val Gardena/Alpe di Siusi.

The longest of these trails is the 1,000 kilometre Sellaronda, which has always been well-known by skiers, but only recently opened as a summer circuit for mountain biking.

Sensation

The Hornblower Esprit, which was recently christened in the New York Harbor, is 90 feet with a capacity of 100 passengers.

Formerly the Vista Jubilee, Sensation is a 114 feet long yacht which accommodates up to 400 passengers.

San Francisco Belle

The 292-foot San Francisco Belle was built in Louisiana in 1994 and was originally used as a floating casino on the St. Charles River in Missouri. Her classic lines, stern paddlewheel and ornate detailing recall the elegant riverboats of the late 1800s.

With a capacity for 2,200 guests, the Belle is the largest capacity dining yacht on the west coast and boasts the grandeur and style that is uniquely San Francisco.

Wild Goose

Originally christened the USS YMS-328, the Wild Goose was a US Navy Yard Mine Sweeper, which was built in Ballard, Washington.

The yacht's most notable owner was actor John Wayne who purchased the vessel in 1962 and entertained many famous passengers, including presidents Richard Nixon and Ronald Reagan, until his death 17 years later.

The yacht was listed on the US National Registry of Historic Places in July 2011.

Zumbrota

One of the most historic yachts sailing out of Marina del Rey, the Zumbrota was built (in 1896 in Sarasota, FL for circus baron Charles Ringling and was named Zumbrota after Zumbro Falls, Minnesota where the large Ringling family had lived.

The historic vessel features teak decks, sparkling brass, polished woodwork and a galley large enough to serve up to 125 passengers were added.

High Spirits

Built in 1929, High Spirits yacht was originally constructed as a sister ship to President Franklin D. Roosevelt's presidential yacht, Sequoia.

Cycling in Serbia

The Balklans state of Serbia offers cyclists landscapes like Djerdap Gorge and the national parks of Fruška Gora and Tara.

For the cultural there are medieval monasteries and ornate Orthodox churches, ancient fortresses and traditional Austro-Hungarian styled villages reflecting the influence many different cultures have had on Serbia over the centuries.

Bike Belgrade

Bike Belgrade offers a range of daily cycling tours of the capital, all of which are escorted by English speaking guides.

Options include the riverside areas of the Sava and Danube or focussing on city centre highlights.

The Circular Day Tour

The Circular Day Tour on Mount Bobija is located in Azbukovica, near the town of Ljubovija, only two hours' drive from Belgrade.

This mountain is rarely included on tourist maps, but is a paradise for nature lovers. The circular route takes you through the canyon of Tribuće with its deciduous forest and rocky outcrops where you can spot the griffon vulture.

The Beast From The East

The Beast From The East (EuroVelo 11), runs through Serbia from the Hungarian border at Djala, travelling south to the Macedonian border at Jablanica.

This route features flatlands, rivers, dense forests and countless villages. From Belgrade, the route crosses the Danube heading south past historic churches and breathtaking scenery before eventually crossing into Macedonia.

The Danube Bike Trail

The Danube Bike Trail stretches for 2,857 km following Europe's second longest river through nine countries.

It also forms part of the even longer EuroVelo 6, the epic "Rivers Route" which stretches from the Atlantic to the Black Sea.

Serbia's section of the Danube Bike Trail is over 660 km in length beginning at Backi Breg on the Hungarian border and running through to Negotin on the Bulgarian border.

Highlights include the Upper Danube Nature Reserve, Fruška Gora National Park and the Djerdap 'Iron Gate' Gorge – the longest in Europe, and one of the most beautiful stretches of the entire Danube.

On route is the 14th century Golubac Fortress, monasteries and Belgrade itself.

Serbian tour operators offering Danube tours include: Magellan and ACE Adventure.

The Iron Curtain Trail

The Iron Curtain Trail is extraordinarily tough.

This EuroVelo 13 route from the Arctic Circle to Turkey traces the Cold War Iron Curtain divide between East and West Europe.

The more moderate Serbia stretch skirts the borders with Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria and runs through the flat plains of the north to the mountains of the East.

Its undoubted highlight is Djerdap Gorge and the passage between the Iron Gates.

Mountain biking

Mountain biking is increasingly popular in Serbia, with marked cycle routes on most of Serbia's well known mountain areas like Kopaonik, Zlatibor and Stara Planina.

There are also cable lifts for transporting cycles.

Western Serbia itself has 400 km of marked paths crossing breathtaking areas such as Tara National Park, which itself has 27 bike path routes.

The Fruška Gora National Park

Fruška Gora National Park also offers a genuine mountain bike experience.

Located 80 km from Belgrade, there are almost a dozen designated forest routes where cyclists can take on steep climbs whilst encountering very few people.

The Tour de Serbie June

The annual Tour de Serbie – founded in 1939, when Serbia had virtually no paved roads –ranks as one of the most important and best organised stage races in this part of Europe.

The Fanatic MTB Marathon

The Fanatic MTB Marathon is one in a series of mountain biking events held each year in the area with this one taking place in May as organised by the aptly named Fanatic Mountain Biking Club.

It is one of the major events of the Serbian MTB season. There are three races – the short (just 32km), the medium (56km) and the big marathon – a full-on 80km of tough riding.
