

Waco Mammoth in Texas becomes a National Park

President Barack Obama has issued a Presidential Proclamation making the Waco Mammoth Site a new unit of the National Park System.

This paleontological site represents the nation's first and only recorded discovery of a nursery herd of Columbian mammoths from the Ice Age, defined as 2.5million to 10,000 years ago.

Visitors can view in situ fossils, including female mammoths, a bull mammoth, and a camel that lived approximately 67,000 years ago.

Of the 24 mammoths uncovered to date, at least 18 were part of the nursery herd.

As a result of an unknown natural catastrophic event, the entire nursery herd died at the same moment in time, which left the skeletons relatively intact, giving this site a one-of-a-kind opportunity to examine the matriarchal herd structure and behaviour of this extinct species.

Wild Planet Adventures : Borneo

Wild Planet Adventures has been granted special access to lead wildlife eco-tours in the remote Maliau Basin Conservation Area, known as *The Lost World of Borneo*.

Located on the strait of Sabah, the region encompasses Malaysia's easternmost state on the island of Borneo.

The Lost World of Borneo is one of three areas left in Borneo that encompass the last stands of the oldest rainforest on earth.

Its geography, a basin surrounded by steep cliffs, has never been fully explored.

The Maliau Basin Conservation Area offers perhaps the only remotely viable chance to see some of the world's rarest animals including the clouded leopard, sun bear, pygmy elephant, Malaysian badger and the reclusive Bornean rhino.

Reasons to write about

Daytona Beach

Daytona Beach is located on Florida's northeast coast, a one-hour drive from Orlando.

Stretching from Ormond-by-the-Sea in the north to the Lighthouse Point Park in Ponce Inlet in the south, Daytona Beach curves along 23 miles of Atlantic Ocean coastline.

Its wide beach with smooth compacted sand has attracted car and motorcycle race enthusiasts since 1902 with Britain's Malcolm Campbell setting the land speed record in 1935.

In 1959 racing moved to the purpose-built Daytona International Speedway, which is currently undergoing a \$400 million transformation.

The city is also the headquarters for NASCAR and the Grand American Road Racing Association as well as the LPGA.

The area is investing more than \$1 billion in renovations and construction projects, with its quintessential American Boardwalk and Pier having had an update along with several new beachfront hotels.

These include a Hard Rock Hotel, which will open in 2016.

A new 'One Daytona' shopping development will offer 1.1 million square feet of shopping, dining, accommodation, theatre and entertainment when it opens in 2016.

Noah's Ark Conservation Programme, Island, Seychelles

North Island, one of Africa's private islands, is situated 30km from the main island of Mahé, Seychelles.

Isolated and with only 11 spacious guest villas, via Wilderness Collection, North Island is known for its luminous white beaches, filigree reefs and azure Indian Ocean.

North Island is also a sanctuary where natural habitats, long neglected, were rehabilitated so that endangered Seychelles fauna and flora could be reintroduced and given a place to grow and thrive.

Some of the key conservation initiatives form part of its Noah's Ark island rehabilitation programme in the Seychelles.

Now well into its second decade, the Noah's Ark project has seen substantial development towards restoring North Island to its original natural state and safeguarding the granitic island ecosystem and the indigenous biodiversity that depends on it.

Of the Island's 201 hectares (518 acres), some 60 hectares (30% of the surface area) will be restored by the end of 2015.

Work has begun on eliminating the last of the Indian myna birds from the Island – one of the most persistent (and vocal) alien species remaining.

The Seychelles white-eye

In 2007, a founder population of 25 Seychelles white-eye's were introduced onto North Island. This was one of the world's rarest birds with a population of 350-400 individuals.

The most recent census of white-eyes, carried out at the end of 2014, found that this initial batch had increased to between 93 and 101 birds, making North Island a globally significant breeding habitat for these rare, small birds.

In addition, seabirds such as boobies and tropicbirds are nesting on the Island again and there has been a steady increase in the number of both the Critically Endangered hawksbill turtle and the Endangered green turtle.

The Teide Observatory, Tenerife

Tenerife has boosted its position as one of the best locations for stargazing, with the introduction of eight new telescopes at the Teide Observatory.

The new telescopes will appeal to “astro-tourists” and scientists looking to unravel the mysteries of the universe.

The new, advanced solar telescopes mark the 30th anniversary of the foundation of the Institute of Astrophysics of the Canary Islands (IAC).

Of the eight introduced, six are robotic telescopes from countries including the USA, Russia, Qatar and Slovakia; and two belong to the QUIJOTE (Q-U-I-Joint Tenerife), a scientific experiment involving multiple partners from Spain and the UK.

The recently-launched Volcano Life Experience operates guided tours several days a week to the Teide Observatory, which is also home to GREGOR, the largest solar telescope in Europe.

Located at 2,390 metres above sea level and next to Mount Teide – Spain’s highest peak at 3,718 metres – Teide Observatory is perfect for studying stars at night due to its geographical location, low-light pollution and extremely clear night skies.

The Observatory rests above the clouds in the volcanic Teide National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and recognised as a ‘Starlight Tourist Destination’ by the Starlight Foundation.

Upon reaching maturity, females habitually return to the beach of their own birth in order to nest. However only one in 1000 hatchlings survive to adulthood.

In an effort to combat this statistic, Velassaru has introduced new protectionist activities to its ongoing CSR commitments, including securing those environments suitable for nesting and monitoring for future eggs and hatchlings.

The resort hopes that this will make the island even safer for these amazing marine creatures and assist in the worldwide conservation effort.
