Coral Spawning in Saint Lucia

Each year, coral release millions of packets of egg and sperm cells that appear underwater as massive pink and white clouds.

They slowly drift to the surface where fertilization occurs.

The next day the sea will be partially covered by pink slicks of coral larvae which represents the next generation of one of the ocean's most vital organisms.

Within a few weeks the larvae will settle on the bottom and begin the process of reef building.

In Saint Lucia the spawning takes place off the beaches of Anse Chastanet and the resort's scuba diving team accurately predicts the night spawning and prepares to take divers to observe the remarkable phenomenon.

In 2014 it will take place between 16 and 18 August.

New Zealand is one of the best cycling and outdoor adventure destinations with stunning scenery and thousands of miles of trails for the novice or expert cyclist.

Clutha Gold Trail

Officially opened in October 2013, the 73 km long Clutha Gold Trail is in the region between Roxburgh and Lawrence, to the west of Dunedin on New Zealand's south island.

It winds through a series of diverse landscapes from rugged semi-arid areas to lush green contoured farmlands, with much of the trail following the waters of the Clutha Mata Au River.

Geared to those of a moderate fitness level, the trail is accessible year-round with a smooth, wide and well-formed path undulating through the rural heartland of the country on a journey of discovery taking in the region's gold mining history.

The Heaphy Track

The Heaphy Track from Aorere to Karamea in the Kahurangi National Park is a mountain bike trail that is open in the winter season from May to September.

The 78.4 km track is a tough ride, taking visitors over numerous swing and suspension bridges; up and down steep slopes; along coastal paths; along stunning backcountry paths through a variety of landscapes, with well-maintained huts and campsites dotted along the route to stay for the night.

The track is suited to riders with advanced skills, which can increase to expert when factoring in distance, remoteness, and the technical skills riders require in adverse weather.

Riders are only permitted to ride the track during the day to protect two threatened nocturnal species found in the area including the Powelliphanta giant land snail, whose shell can measure up to 9cm across, and Roroa (otherwise known as great spotted kiwi) which can be found in the area.

The Otago Central Rail Trail

The 150km long Otago Central Rail Trail winds its way between Clyde and Middlemarch in the Otago region of the south Island.

Suitable for all but the very unfit, the four day complete ride can be easily be cut down by choosing a section of the trail.

Riders travel on well prepared gravel trails; through tunnels and over bridges that were once the secret preserve of railway workers, and all through spectacular landscapes typical of the region.
