# The Mauritshuis in The Hague, the Netherlands

The Mauritshuis in The Hague, home of Vermeer's Girl with a Pearl Earring, will open on 27 June 2014 following a major renovation.

The Mauritshuis is a small museum with a lakeside location in the heart of The Hague, the historic city that is home to the Dutch Parliament and Royal Family.

# Vikings: life and legend at the British Museum, London

6 March to 22 June 2014

The Viking Age (800–1050) was a period of major change across Europe.

The Vikings expanded from their Scandinavian homelands to create an international network connecting cultures over four continents, where artistic, religious and political ideas met.

The Vikings' skill in shipbuilding and seafaring was central to their culture and success, and at the heart of the exhibition will be a 37-metre-long warship, which is the longest Viking ship ever discovered.

Many other new discoveries, including part of a mass grave of Viking warriors, will be on display for the first time as well as personal objects, including jewellery, amulets and idols. For more information contact the

Perfect for cyclists, the Paris Respire scheme also closes off parts of the city, such as roads by the river Seine, the Marais and Montmatre, every Sunday and over bank holidays between 9am-5pm.

Paris benefits from public scheme Vélib Bike Hire, which has more than 1,200 docking stations and 18,000 bikes around Paris.

Tip: Gain an extra 15 minutes free, if the docking station is fully occupied, in order to return your bike to another station.

### **Berlin**

National scheme Call-A-Bike offers over 100 rental locations, and Berlin's tubes and trains even offer special tickets permitting bikes to be taken inboard.

Only over 18s can buy access to the scheme, although anyone over 14 can ride one of the public bikes

MITip: Cycle behind public buses 100 or 200 for the best scenic views of the city, as these routes pass most tourist spots.

### Nice

Nice's biking scheme Vélo bleu offers 175 docking stations around the city, and rental from just 1 Euro an hour.

Visitors should experience biking down the flat Promenade des Anglais – a five-mile walkway connecting Chateau Hill with Nice Airport.

Tip: Follow bus route 14 for a challenging ride to the top of Mount Boron in the Parc Municipal du Mt. Boron for the best city views.

# Komodo dragons, Indonesia

Several Komodo dragons (Varanus Komodoensis) have been found living in Mbeliling Forest on Flores Island, Indonesia.

It had been believed that this ancient, endangered species could only be found in Komodo National Park in East Nusa Tenggara.

A team of conservationists confirmed the presence of the Komodo dragon, the world's largest lizard, in the extreme west of Flores, after camera traps recorded a community of 12 surviving near the coastal villages of Golo Mori and Tanjung Kerita Mese.

The discovery proves that Komodos can survive outside of Komodo National Park, and adds to Indonesia's reputation for boasting one of the world's most bio-diverse natural landscapes with abundant wildlife.

Named after the island on which it was discovered, the Komodo dragon has inhabited the natural landscapes of Indonesia for millions of years although its existence was unknown to humans until around 100 years ago.

These prehistoric lizards can grow up to 10 feet long and are typically found wandering freely around Komodo National Park, which covers the islands of Komodo, Rinca and Padar.

Declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1986, this is the only place on earth where visitors have the unique opportunity to see them up close in their native habitat.

Indonesia is comprised of more than 17,000 tropical islands with wildlife that includes great apes, rhinos, tigers and some of the rarest species of birds on the planet.
